Nehru-Wangchuck Scholarship 2025 intake

The Department of Workforce Planning and Skills Development (DWPSD) under the Ministry of Education and Skills Development (MoESD), in collaboration with the Royal Civil Service Commission and the Embassy of India, is pleased to announce the Nehru-Wangchuck Scholarship for applicants from the Non-Civil Service Sector. The scholarship details are outlined below:

Non-Civil Service Sector (3 slots)

Sl.No	Field of Study	Target Participants
1	Masters of Business and Commerce Studies (MBA/Commerce/Dev. Eco/Finance/accounting)	Business Managers/Analysts/Subject lecturers/Credit Officers
2	Masters in Tourism/Hospitality Management	Tourism/Hospitality managers/subject lecturers
3	Masters of Media Studies (Creative Industries/ Media/Journalism/Film Making/Multimedia)	Film directors/producers/creative industry managers/professionals
4	Master of Law (Dispute Resolution/Intellectual Property Law/International Law/Environmental Law)	Law professionals/subject lecturers

1. Specific Criteria Include

- Should have a bachelors degree in the relevant field of study
- Should have a minimum of 2 years relevant work experience with the nominating agency. However, as per the HRD Rules and Regulations for the Non-Civil Service Sector, the minimum work experience required for a subject lecturer is one year

2. Benefits of Scholarship

The selected candidates shall receive the following benefits during training:

- Tuition Fees and other admission-related costs
- Monthly Stipend: Nu. 50,000;
- Book allowance (annually): Nu. 12,500;
- One-time establishment allowance: Nu. 10,000;
- Thesis/Research Grant of Nu. 63,000 on the actual submission of receipts (eligible only if the course is research-based);
- Airfare (one time to & fro);
- Coverage of health insurance (Up to Nu. 15000/-)

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3. Required Documents

- Duly-filled the In-service HRD form and documents mentioned in the In-service HRD form. **Inservice HRD Form** can be downloaded from <https://education.gov.bt/pages/forms/>
- Mark sheet and certificates (Class XII and Bachelor degree)
- Any other merit certificates

Interested and eligible candidates from the Non-Civil Service Sector may submit their application in person to the SPLD, DWPSD, or through email at gakiwangmo@moesd.gov.bt by 31st May, 2025

4. Deadline for the application

All interested applicants must ensure to apply for the scholarship and submit required documents by *31-May-2025*.

5. Shortlisting:

- Three candidates from each field will be shortlisted based on merit ranking (as per HRD Rules and Regulation for Non-Civil Service Sector). The shortlisted candidates will be announced through MoESD's Website and Facebook page.

6. Selection Interview and Interview Result

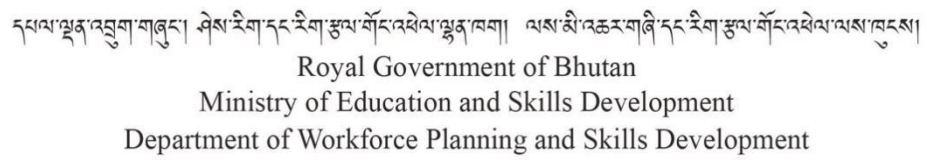
- All of the shortlisted candidates will have to make a 10-minute presentation on the selected topic during the selection interview (the topic for the presentation will be shared with shortlisted candidates on the day of the interview).
- Only the three best candidates based on performance during the selection interview shall be selected.
- The candidates shall be judged based on their performance in their respective jobs, leadership attributes and their post-study plans as portrayed during the selection interview.

7. Post selection procedure

Upon announcement of the interview result, selected civil servants should submit the following documents to the HRDD, RCSC within five working days from the date of announcement of the interview result, failing which scholarship may be given to the standby candidate:

- Acceptance of Scholarship Form with assurance from the agency (link for the Form will be provided during the announcement of shortlisted candidates)
- Security clearance
- Audit clearance
- Medical Fitness certificate

*Note: **Selected candidates must seek admission to reputed Universities in India, which are recognized by accreditation bodies in India or International Accreditation Councils within a given time period from the interview result announcement date. The RCSC shall facilitate in processing the admission. However, if a candidate fails to secure admission within the given time, the scholarship shall be offered to the standby candidate.***



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
