CAMP RULES

These rules are designed to ensure a safe, inclusive, and enriching experience for every participant. By adhering to these guidelines, you contribute to the spirit of brotherhood, service, and respect that defines this Jamboree.

1. Fundamental Principles & Conduct

1.1 Uphold the Scout Promise and Scout Law at all times. Demonstrate respect, discipline, honesty, and cooperation.

1.2 Bullying, harassment, discrimination, or any form of misconduct will not be tolerated.

1.3 Respect the traditions, laws, and cultural sensitivities of Bhutan. International participants are expected to comply with national regulations and camp guidelines.

2. Camp Discipline & Routine

2.1 Attendance at all scheduled activities is mandatory unless officially excused.

2.2 Remain within designated camp boundaries. Leaving the site requires formal written permission from the Camp Authority/escort in case of international participants.

2.3 Night silence is strictly enforced from 10:00 PM to 5:00 AM (*Only for National Scouts*)

2.4 Maintain a smart appearance by wearing the proper Scout uniform during ceremonies and as instructed.

3. Safety, Security & Well-being

Safety & Security Safety briefings must be attended before participating in adventure activities.

3.1 Possession or use of alcohol, tobacco, nicotine (vaping), narcotics, or any illegal substances is strictly forbidden. Weapons and dangerous items are prohibited.

3.2 Attend all mandatory safety briefings before adventure activities. Strictly follow instructions from Base Leaders and Safety Officers.

3.3 Immediately report any injury or illness to the Camp Medical Team. Participants must disclose all pre-existing medical conditions to their contingent leader upon arrival.

3.4 Open fires are permitted only in authorized, supervised zones.

4. Environmental Stewardship

The Jamboree shall observe a Leave No Trace Principle.

4.1 Waste must be segregated as per the segregation protocols.

4.2 Maintain clean and orderly campsites at all times.

4.3 Use water and electricity responsibly.

4.4 Do not damage or remove natural vegetation.

5. Leadership & Community

5.1 Respect and follow the guidance of the Camp Chief, Programme Director, and sub-camp Chiefs.

5.2 Platoon Leaders are held accountable for the welfare and conduct of their members.

5.3 Address and resolve disputes through established, respectful reporting channels.

6. Media & Digital Etiquette

6.1 National participants are not allowed to bring their mobile phones to the National Scout Jamboree. For International participants, use of mobile phones is permitted only at designated places and during specified times, as informed by the organizers

6.2 Ensure all photography and videography respects the privacy and dignity of others.

6.3 Media engagement and the issuance of official statements require prior approval from the Camp Authority. However, special consideration will be granted to international participants during excursion periods, allowing them to capture Bhutan's landscapes and create lasting memories.

7. Property & Equipment

7.1 Participants are fully responsible for the proper care and safekeeping of all camp equipment issued to them. Any damage to facilities or property resulting from negligence may result in required compensation.

8. Disciplinary Measures

Violation of these rules may lead to:

8.1 Verbal warning.

8.2 Written warning.

Suspension from specific activities.

1. Immediate removal from the camp (reserved for serious infractions).
2. Formal reporting to respective schools or National Scout Associations.

9. Cultural Respect & International Participation

9.1 Participants shall respect all cultures, languages, and traditions represented at the Jamboree.

9.2 Modest dress and appropriate behaviour must be maintained in line with Bhutanese values.

9.3 Religious and cultural sensitivities shall be respected at all times.

9.4 International participants must carry valid identification and required documentation.

9.5 Leadership & Community Chain of Command: Respect and follow the guidance of the Camp Chief, Programme Coordinators.

10. Health & Welfare

10.1 Participants must disclose any medical conditions to their contingent leader.

10.2 Hygienic standards must be maintained in personal and patrol areas.

10.3 Safe drinking water guidelines must be followed.

10.4 Camp curfew timings must be observed.

11. Leadership & Platoon System

11.1 Platoon Leaders are responsible for the discipline and welfare of their platoon members.

11.2 Instructions from Camp Chief, Programme Director, and sub-camp Chiefs must be respected.

11.3 Disputes shall be resolved through proper reporting channels.

11.4 Dismissal from the camp in instances of serious misconduct.

11.5 Formal reporting to the participant's home school or affiliated organization.

Special Provisions for International Participants

All international contingents are required to:

- Channel all coordination efforts through their officially appointed Liaison Officers.
- Strictly comply with all Bhutanese national laws and immigration policies.
- Demonstrate respect for local customs, traditions, and community guidelines throughout their stay.
